Agriculture Energy Investment Plan	On-farm energy grants are available to eligible primary producers until March 2020 or until available funding is exhausted. Grants will be provided on a "dollar for dollar" cash co-contribution basis. You will need an on-farm energy assessment, or an equivalent certified on-farm energy assessment conducted in the past two years, to access one of the grants under the Agriculture Investment Energy Plan (AEIP). On-Farm Emergency Water Infrastructure Rebate Scheme	A grant of up to \$25,000 is available to assist farmers impacted by drought and dry seasonal conditions invest in on-farm water infrastructure that addresses animal welfare needs or for permanent horticultural plantings. Farm businesses across Victoria can make an application if they can demonstrate a critical water need resulting from current seasonal conditions.
